Registration is required prior to enrolment. Upon successful registration you will be notified of the enrolment procedures. If you have previously registered with the Board's course in the past, you would not be required to register again. Applicants are required to be residing in Australia for the duration of their candidature for the Board's examinations. Please contact the LPAB office if you wish to apply for an exception to this requirement. The Board's examinations are not registered as a Course for Overseas Students and registration as a Student-at-Law does not confer any visa entitlement.

Your application may be delayed if you have not completed every question. The form may be completed and signed electronically or printed out to complete and sign. You may scan and email your application to **lpab@justice.nsw.gov.au**

You must provide 100 points of identification and complete your personal contact details. Please also attach a digital colour passport style photo in .jpg format.

Part B: Qualifications for entry and academic exemptions

You may qualify to register as a Student-at-Law if you meet one of the criteria listed on the following page. Using the table, insert the entry category number applicable to your qualification on the application form.

You will need to supply a copy of the documentation indicated in the table. Indicate whether or not you have received or applied for academic exemptions. If the Board is already in possession of documentation that satisfies the entry criteria, you are not required to resubmit the documentation with this application.

When to apply?

To be considered for commencement in the May semester, you must lodge your application by 1 March. To be considered for commencement in the November semester, you must lodge your application by 1 September. We suggest you do not delay your application until the cut-off dates. The earlier you apply, the earlier your application is likely to be considered. Late applications may not be approved.

Please ensure you attach all the required documentation. Your application cannot be processed if any of your documentation is missing.
